Second, Volume One of the Africa Textbook Project is soon to be released. There is a newsclip about this on page 2.

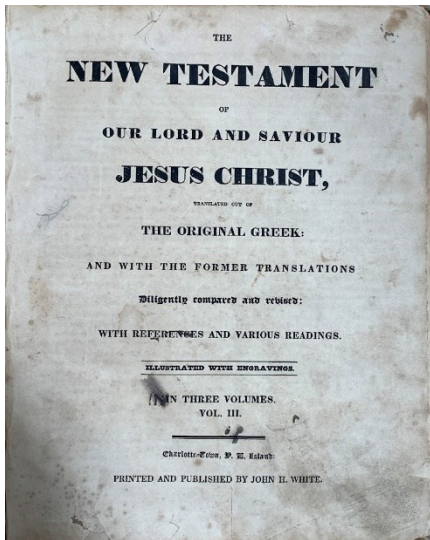
We pray you will be blessed through these publications and give thanks to the Lord for all who have made them possible. – The Director

ANNOUNCING THE PRINT RELEASE FOR THE CONTINENT OF AFRICA: NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER 2023

Volume One of *A Survey of Presbyterian Mission History in Africa* is scheduled to be printed in October and will be available in Africa in November. A global print edition will be forthcoming, DV, in 2024. Four years in the making, with 26 contributors and over 150 images, the publisher will also be producing an e-version of the book.

A huge word of thanks to all who have faithfully been praying for this textbook project over the last four years. Many obstacles were encountered along the way during those Covid lockdown years. We also give thanks for all who financially made volume one possible.

Please pray now for the **distribution of Volume One across all of Africa** and also its promotion by all the writers and others. Also, please pray for the speaking engagements to launch this book (starting in November and December in Africa). There is much work now to be done for volume two which has around 30 contributors, so we also ask for prayer for this next volume.

We have received about 98 sponsorships now for Volume One. Sponsors are still needed for more college libraries in Africa to receive the work and for class texts. The cost is approximately \$100.00CAN per package (1 print copy including courier and one e-copy). Packages may vary in quantity depending on where in Africa it may be going. **If you would like to help with a sponsorship**, see details at the end of the newsletter. Thanks very much to all who have helped thus far with this sponsorship programme.

This teaching time will also be a venue to start to launch Volume One of the above-mentioned textbook in Uganda and South Africa. This is truly exciting to now take this work into a seminary classroom.
